ONE WEEK AFTER

Eight days ago, Paris Saint-Germain played at Leigh Sport Village against Manchester United. A first game between both teams in an official competition. During this game, the Rouge & Bleu dominated the game (16 attempts), but the final result was a draw (1-1).

CLUTCH GAME

In case of victory tonight, the Jocelyn Prêcheur's players will be qualified for the 2023-2024 UEFA Women's Champions League campaign. Since 2018-2019 season, Paris always played the group phase and reach three times the semi-finals (and twice the quarterfinals). For now, the Parisian players participated in the competition 9 times in the last 10 years.

CHAWINGA IN GREAT SHAPE

The new Parisian striker, Tabitha Chawinga, made significant debut with the Club. The Malawian scored twice in her two last game played with the Rouge & Bleu shirt, against Saint-Etienne and Manchester United.

SHE KNOWS THE OPPONENT

Two Rouge & Bleu know their opponents well. Before signing her contract with the capital club, Dutch international Jackie Groenen wore the red colours of the Manchester United outfit for three seasons (between 2019 and 2022). French international Aïssatou Tounkara arrived in Paris last Summer from Manchester after a season with the Red Devils.

BACK ON THE SUMMER MERCATO

Paris Saint-Germain welcomed 8 new players to their ranks this summer: goalkeeper Katarzyna Kiedrzynek (POL), defenders Viola Calligaris (SUI), Aïssatou Tounkara (FRA), Nicole Payne (NIG), Thiniba Samoura (FRA) and Clare Hunt (AUS), and also midfielder Ana Vitoria (BRE). Striker Tabitha Chawinga (MAL) is the last name among that list. The capital club can also count on its young players coming back from last season loan: Magnaba Folquet and Jade Le Guilly.

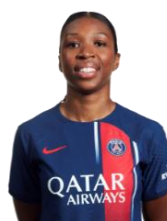

1 Katarzyna KIEDRZYNEK

GOALKEEPER • 32 YO

Katarzyna Kiedrzynek made her football debut with Polish club Motor Lublin in 2004. After three seasons, the goalkeeper played for Gornik Lezna from 2007 to 2013. "Kasia" then moved to Paris Saint-Germain. In 7 seasons with the Rouge et Bleu, the Pole took part in over 120 matches, two Champions League finals and won a French Cup. She then signed for VfL Wolfsburg (GER) in 2020.



16 Constance PICAUD

GOALKEEPER • 24 YO

Born in Challans, Constance Picaud began her career in her native Vendée. From US Marais-Beauvoir-sur-Mer to ESOF Vendée La Roche-sur-Yon, which she joined at just 15, the young goalkeeper honed her skills over a six-year period before moving to Normandy to sign her first professional contract with Le Havre Athletic Club. A regular in the HAC goal, she also discovered France's elite, as she was one of the key architects of the club's rise to the Arkema D1 at the end of the 2019-2020 season. In February 2021, Constance was selected for the French senior team for the first time. The following summer, the goalkeeper laid down her gloves at Paris Saint-Germain. In the summer of 2023, Constance Picaud took part in the 2023 World Cup with Les Bleues.



30 Océane TOUSSAINT

GOALKEEPER • 19 YO

Océane Toussaint began playing football in Colombes, near Paris, before joining the Parisian club at the age of 14. In her first season with Paris Saint-Germain, the young goalkeeper won the French U19 Championship alongside a number of players who have since joined the professional ranks, including Laurina Fazer, Magnaba Folquet and Jade Le Guilly. In February 2023, the young goalkeeper was voted "Titi d'Or", a trophy awarded to the best player in the U19 section.



2 Thiniba SAMOURA

DEFENDER • 19 YO

Thiniba Samoura began playing football at the age of 11 in Thiais (Val-de-Marne), before joining the Paris Football Club academy four years later. After playing at U16 and U19 level, the Parisian made her first-team debut against Dijon FCO in November 2021. Since then, the young defender has played 9 D1 Arkema matches and 1 Coupe de France match for PFC.



5 Elisa DE ALMEIDA

DEFENDER • 24 YO

Born in Châtenay-Malabry in the Hauts-de-Seine department, Elisa took her first steps in football at Épinay, aged just 6. After a brief spell at Villebon, the young defender made her professional debut for FCF Juvisy when she was just 18. In 2019, she left her training club, now Paris FC, to join Montpellier HSC in the Hérault region of France. After joining Les Bleues at U17 level, Elisa went on to play for all the national youth teams, including winning the European U19 Championship alongside Grâce Geyoro and Marie-Antoinette Katoto in 2016. Three years later, she was called up to the senior team on several occasions. She will be taking part in the 2023 World Cup in Australia and New Zealand with the French team.



7 Sakina KARCHAOU

DEFENDER • 26 YO

Before arriving at Paris Saint-Germain, Sakina Karchaoui already had a fine CV to her name. Born in Salon-de-Provence, she began her career in the south of France with Miramas, before joining Montpellier's youth academy at the age of 13, where she signed her first professional contract 4 years later. After 8 seasons in the first team at the Hérault club, the left-back signed for Olympique Lyonnais, where she stayed for a year. In 2021, the French international has decided to bring her experience of the French league and her knowledge of the highest level to the ranks of Parisiennes, who have just been crowned French champions. Alongside five Parisian players, she will be taking part in the 2023 Women's World Cup.

15 Clare HUNT

DEFENDER • 24 YO

Clare Hunt has always played in her native Australia. In 2016, she played for the capital club, Canberra United FC, and then for the University of Sydney women's football team for a year. She then joined Western Sydney Wanderers in September 2021. Clare's first cap for the national team came in February 2023, in a 4-0 win over the Czech Republic in the Nations Cup. The semi-finalist at the last FIFA World Cup, held this summer in Australia and New Zealand, was included in the tournament's XI and has 13 caps for the Matildas. In September 2023, the Australian joined Paris Saint-Germain, tying her to the club until 2026.



16 Jade LE GUILLY

DEFENDER • 21 YO

A product of the Parisian youth system, Jade Le Guilly was born in Nogent-sur-Marne (Val-de-Marne) and began playing football at the age of 8 with AS Vexin Marines (Val-d'Oise). And she was only 12 when she joined the capital club! First on the pitches of the Paris Saint-Germain Association, then with the U19 section, Jade worked her way up through the ranks of the Parisian team, winning the French U19 championship in 2019 and wearing the captain's armband.



19 Viola CALLIGARIS

DEFENDER • 27 YO

Born in Samen (Switzerland), the Swiss international began her professional career at the age of 15, in 2012, with SC Kriens. A year later, she signed for BSC Young Boys, where she played for four seasons. In 2017, the 27-year-old defender left Switzerland to join Atletico Madrid, a club with whom she won two domestic championships (2018, 2019). Viola Calligaris then signed for Valencia for a season, before spending three seasons at Levante. A Swiss international, she has been called up to take part in the 2023 Women's World Cup, alongside her compatriot Ramona Bachmann.



33 Tara ELIMBI

DEFENDER • 18 YO

Tara Elimbi was born in Enghien-les-Bains in the Val d'Oise in 2005. She began playing football at the age of 8 at the Epinay-sur-Seine football academy, before joining the Paris Saint-Germain training centre in 2020. She is a member of the French Under-19 team, with whom she has 12 caps and one goal to her name.



8 Grace GEYORO

MIDFIELDER • 25 YO

Born in Kolwezi in the Democratic Republic of Congo, young Grace began kicking a ball around with her older brother. Having arrived at the Club in 2012 at the age of 15, Grace Geyoro completed her entire training at Paris Saint-Germain. The Orléans native played her first-team minutes against Issy-les-Moulineaux on 12 October 2014, and signed her first professional contract a year later. Appointed captain this season, the midfielder has now made 171 appearances and scored 22 goals for the Rouge et Bleu, winning a Challenge National U19 (2016), two Coupe de France (2018, 2022) and the French D1 title in the 2020-2021 season. She will be taking part in the 2023 World Cup with Les Bleues.



14 Jackie GROENEN

MIDFIELDER • 27 YO

Practising judo alongside football in her native country, Jackie Groenen began her professional career in Germany in 2011 with SG Essen-Schönebeck, before joining MSV Duisburg a few months later. In 2014, the Dutchwoman signed for Chelsea FC in England for one season. She returned to Germany in May 2015, signing for FFC Frankfurt. She then played for Manchester United for three seasons, making 57 appearances. In 2023, she will take part in the World Cup in Australia and New Zealand, accompanied by Lieke Martens.

18 Laurina FAZER

MIDFIELDER • 19 YO

Laurina Fazer signed her first professional contract with her hometown club, Les Rouge et Bleu, aged just 16. The U17 international has regularly displayed her talent and rigour with the Rouge et Bleu U19s, with whom the native of Argenteuil (Val-d'Oise) won the French Championship for the category in 2019, following a 5-1 final victory over Olympique Lyonnais. After a more than convincing 2021-2022 season with the professional squad, the Parisian starlet was named best D1 Arkema prospect at the UNFP Trophies. Laura Fazer was called up by coach Hervé Renard to take part in the 2023 Women's World Cup.



24 Korbin ALBERT

MIDFIELDER • 19 YO

Born in Grayslake in the United States, Korbin Albert began playing football in her homeland at an early age. She joined Eclipse Select Soccer Club in Chicago at the age of 14, before going on to play for the University of Notre Dame in South Bend from 2021. She reached the quarter-finals of the championship before being named one of the three finalists for the Mac Hermann Trophy at the end of 2022, awarded to the best female university players.



21 Sandy BALTIMORE

MIDFIELDER • 21 YO

Having joined Paris Saint-Germain at the age of 15, the native of Colombes did not even have to wait a year before making her sensational debut in the professional squad. And at just 20 years of age, the tireless No21 was already establishing herself as one of the pillars of Olivier Echouafni's team. As technical as she is quick, efficient and selfless, Sandy is a complete player, capable of playing both wide and up front.



25 MAGNABA FOLQUET

MIDFIELDER • 19 YO

A child of the Paris region, it was in the south-east of Paris, and more specifically in Émerainville, that Magnaba Folquet began playing football at the tender age of 10. After a spell with US Torcy, she took the plunge and joined the Paris Saint-Germain training centre at the age of 15, where she honed her football skills. With the capital club, 'Titi' practised her skills, joined the U19 team and began making her first appearances for the professional team in the 2020-2021 season. Rewarded for her efforts, the young midfielder went on to play for France's U17, U19 and U20 squads, signing her first professional contract in April 2022.



27 Ana VITORIA

MIDFIELDER • 23 YO

Ana Vitória started out playing football with Brazilian club Rondonópolis EC before being loaned out to Mixto EC and then Academia FC. In the summer of 2017, she signed for São Paulo club SC Corinthians for two seasons. The Auriverde international left her native country in 2019 to join SL Benfica in Portugal. She has won nine trophies with the Portuguese club: two domestic championships (2021, 2022), one Portuguese second division championship (2019), one Portuguese Cup (2019), three League Cups (2020, 2021, 2023) and two Portuguese Supercups (2019, 2022).



9 Marie-Antoinette KATOTO

STRIKER • 25 YO

Born in Colombes, 'MAK' joined the capital club at just 12 years of age. A little jewel that the City of Light has been lucky enough to nurture for more than 10 years, the striker is already an established player in the world game's elite. Three times top scorer in the league and voted best player by her peers, as she was last season, this shy youngster cultivates paradoxes. An explosive sprinter, a disconcerting dribbler and a silky finisher, Marie-Antoinette Katoto is blessed with a power that has hurt many defences since the start of her career. In September 2023, the number 9 was back on the pitch after a fourteen-month absence following a cruciate ligament rupture.

10 Ramona BACHMANN

STRIKER • 31 YO

Ramona Bachmann was born in Lucerne, Switzerland. After making a name for herself with Chelsea (75 appearances and 13 goals), winning two English Championships (2017 and 2019) and an FA Cup (2018) with the London club, the striker joined Paris Saint-Germain in 2020. A senior international since 2007, she has 126 caps and 54 goals for Switzerland. In 2015, the striker played in the "Nati"'s first World Cup, in Canada, where her team reached the Round of 8. In the summer of 2023, she will travel to Australia and New Zealand with Viola Calligaris of Paris to represent Switzerland at the 2023 World Cup.



11 Lieke MARTENS

STRIKER • 30 YO

Lieke Martens began her professional career at the age of 17 with SC Heerenveen. At the end of her first season, she moved to VVV Vento before joining Standard de Liège in 2011. The striker went on to play for German club Duisburg and Swedish outfits Kopparbergs Göteborg FC and FC Rosengård. For the last five seasons, she has played for FC Barcelona, with whom she won her first Champions League title and nine domestic titles. Lieke Martens was first called up to the national team in 2011. After taking part in Euro 2013 and the 2015 World Cup, she won the European Championship in 2017 with the "Oranje" in front of their home crowd. In 2023, she will take part in the World Cup in Australia and New Zealand.



20 Amalie VANGSGAARD

STRIKER • 26 YO

Amalie Vangsgaard began playing football at Jetsmark IF at the age of 4. The Dane then moved on to the youth teams at Fortuna Hjørring, where she made her professional debut in 2014. With the Scandinavian club, Amalie Vangsgaard won two Danish championships and a national cup. She also made her debut in the UEFA Women's Champions League at the age of 17. After a two-year break, the striker signed for FC Nordsjaelland in 2019. She won another Danish Cup there before leaving her homeland in 2021 to join Swedish club Linköpings FC. In 2023, she will represent Denmark at the World Cup.



22 Tabitha CHAWINGA

STRIKER • 27 YO

Tabitha Chawinga started playing football at the age of five, with DD Sunshine, a club in her hometown of Lilongwe (Malawi). In 2014, Tabitha moved to Sweden to play for Krokoms Dvörsätts IF (3rd division) and then Kvarnsvedens IK (2nd division) for a year. In the 2015-2016 season, she finished as the league's top scorer with 43 goals, helping the Scandinavian club reach the national top flight. In 2018, the striker signed for Jiangsu LFC (China), where she won the player of the season award two years running (2018, 2019). In 2021, she signed for Wuhan Jiangnan University before being loaned out to Inter Milan. In Italy, the Malawian became top scorer in women's Serie A with 23 goals. She joined Paris in September 2023 on a season-long loan.



33 Manssita TRAORE

STRIKER • 20 YO

Born in Noisy-le-Grand in Seine-Saint-Denis, Manssita Traoré began playing football in the Paris region with SFC Neuilly-sur-Marne at the age of 9. Four years later, she joined her hometown club before moving to Paris Saint-Germain's training centre in 2019. Winner of the "Titi d'Or" at the end of the 2021-2022 season, which rewards the most promising young talents at the Parisian club, Manssita Traoré made her first appearance in the professional squad on 1 June 2022 against Stade de Reims. A few months later, she played her first UEFA Women's Champions League match at the Stade Jean-Bouin against Chelsea FC.

JOCELYN PRÊCHEUR

HEAD COACH

Jocelyn Prêcheur began his coaching career as assistant to his father, Gérard Prêcheur. A member of the Olympique Lyonnais staff, he then accompanied him to China to take charge of Jiangsu Women FC from 2017. After one season, Gérard Prêcheur stepped down as head coach, leaving the reins to his son Jocelyn. In three seasons, he won 6 trophies with the Nanjing club.

In 2021-2022, Jocelyn Prêcheur took over at Meizhou Hakka FC, again in China.

In the summer of 2022, he signed for Paris Saint-Germain as assistant coach. In September 2023, Jocelyn Prêcheur was appointed head coach of Les Rouge et Bleu.
