A TOUGH ONE TO START

Tonight, Paris Saint-Germain plays its 1st game of the UEFA Women's Champions League group phase with a battle against Chelsea, the three times holder of the English league.

GOOD MEMORIES IN GROUP PHASE

Paris was the only club, with Barcelona, to win all its group matches in the 2021-2022 edition (six wins in 6 games). It is also the team who scored the most goals in the group stage (25), one more than Barcelona.

DÉJÀ VU

Ramona Bachmann knows the London club because she spent four seasons there. Between 2016 and 2020, the "Nati" player scored 13 goals in 75 appearances for the "Blues" and won two English Championships (2017 and 2019) and one English Cup (2018).

FORMER ROUGE & BLEU

This game is also an opportunity to see a former player from Paris Saint-Germain. Eve Perisset, right-back with the Rouge et Bleu between 2016 and 2020, played two seasons in Bordeaux before joining Chelsea FC in the 2022 off-season. By signing a three-season contract with the London club, she became the first French player to wear the Blues' shirt.

TOP RANKINGS

Gérard Prêcheur's players are on top of the D1 Arkema statistics rankings. Kadidiatou Diani and Grace Geyoro are the top scorers of the league with 4 goals each. Three players are among the best in assists: Bachmann, Baltimore and Diani made two assists each in the competition this season.

Océane TOUSSAINT

GOALKEEPER

18 yo French

A native of Seine-Saint-Denis, in Bagnolet, Océane Toussaint began playing football when she was only ten years old, at Racing Club de France. In 2018, the young goalkeeper joined the Paris Saint-Germain training centre. Now a member of the French Under-20 team, she first went through the U16 and U19 women's selections.

Constance PICAUD

GOALKEEPER

24 yo French

Constance Picaud was born in Challans and began her career in her native region of Vendée. From the US Marais-Beauvoir-sur-Mer team to ESOF Vendée La Roche-sur-Yon, which she joined at the age of 15, the young goalkeeper honed her skills over a six-year period before moving to Normandy to sign her first professional contract with Le Havre Athletic Club. A regular in the HAC goal, she also discovered the French top flight there, as she was one of the main architects of the club's promotion to the D1 Arkema at the end of the 2019-2020 season. In February 2021, Constance was selected for the French senior team for the first time. The following summer, the goalkeeper got a move to Paris Saint-Germain...

Sarah BOUHADDI

GOALKEEPER

35 yo French

Originally from Cannes, Sarah Bouhaddi started at the highest level with the CNFE Clairefontaine in 2002. Four years later, she joined Toulouse for one season, then FCF Juvisy, where she remained until 2009. Voted best goalkeeper in the world four times (2016, 2017, 2018 and 2020), the neo-Parisian played for Olympique Lyonnais, a club with which she won 12 French championships, 8 French Cups, 1 Champions Trophy and 8 Champions League. She has made 306 appearances in all competitions with OL. Last season, the 35-year-old was loaned to OL Reign.

Elisa DE ALMEIDA

DEFENDER

24 yo French

Elisa was born in Châtenay-Malabry in the Hauts-de-Seine region and began playing football in Épinay at the age of six. After a short spell at Villebon, the young defender made her professional debut for FCF Juvisy at the age of 18. In 2019, she left her first club, now Paris FC, to join Montpellier HSC. After starting out with Les Bleues at U17 level, Elisa then went on to play for all the national youth teams, including winning the European U19 Championship alongside Grâce Geyoro and Marie-Antoinette Katoto in 2016. Three years later, she was called up to the senior team, where she has since had numerous caps.

Sakina KARCHAOUI

DEFENDER

26 yo French

Before arriving at Paris Saint-Germain, Sakina Karchaoui already had a good CV to her name. She was born in Salon-de-Provence and began her career in the south of France, in Miramas, before joining the Montpellier academy at the age of 13 and signing her first professional contract there four years later. After 8 seasons in the first team at the Hérault club, the left back joined Olympique Lyonnais, where she stayed for a year. In 2021, the French international has decided to bring her experience of the French league and her knowledge of the highest level to the Parisian team, who have just been crowned French champions.

Ashley LAWRENCE

DEFENDER

27 yo Canadian

Born in Toronto, where she started playing, Ashley Lawrence is considered to be one of the best full-backs in women's football. In 2016, she won the bronze medal with Canada at the Rio Olympic Games and was voted "best player" in her position during the competition, despite training as a midfielder in her youth career. Ashley is a multi-faceted talent. The young star decided to opt for Paris Saint-Germain when she left North America in 2017, rapidly becoming one of the remarked-upon players in Europe wearing the Rouge et Bleu shirt. A real battler, Ashley intends on writing history in Paris colours. In 2020, Ashley Lawrence won the Olympic Games with Canada in Tokyo.

Amanda ILESTEDT

DEFENDER

29 yo Swedish

Born in Sölvesborg, Amanda Illestedt started her pro career in 2009 aged just 16 at FC Rosengård. In seven seasons, she won no fewer than five league titles, two Swedish Cups and four Super Cups. In 2017, the defender headed to Germany for two seasons with Turbine Potsdam before moving to Bayern Munich, winning the Bundesliga in 2020/21. Freshly crowned German champion, she now has one ambition with Paris Saint-Germain: writing a new successful chapter in her career.

Estelle CASCARINO

DEFENDER

25 yo French

Born in St Priest near Lyon, Estelle Cascarino started her career at Olympique Lyonnais aged 13. Five years later, she signed her first pro deal, but left after a year to join Juvisy, which later became Paris FC after the fusion of the two clubs in 2017. After two seasons in the Paris region, she moved to Bordeaux in 2019 where she played for a further two campaigns. At the same time, the left-back has worked her way through the international ranks, winning EURO U19 with France before joining the senior set-up in 2020. Now 24, Estelle took the next step in her career by moving to Paris Saint-Germain.

23

Marina GEORGIEVA

DEFENDER

25 yo Austrian

Born in the quiet town of Melk, Austria, the young Marina first played football on the banks of the Danube and more precisely at FK Hainburg from the age of seven, giving her a taste for the game that encouraged her to join ASK-BSC Bruck/Leitha six years later to finetune her development as a defender. At just 15 years old, she signed her first professional contract with SKN St Pölten Frauen, where she won two Frauenliga titles and three Ladies Cups. Having broken into the professional game by this point and just turned 20, the young defender then crossed the border to join German side 1. FFC Turbine Potsdam. After one season, she went on to join SC Sand, spending four successful seasons there and making no fewer than 62 appearances. Marina's rise would take her all the way up to the Austrian national team, which she represented at EURO 2017 and at EURO 2022, and it was precisely in 2022 that her career took another turn, as she joined Paris Saint-Germain!

LI MENGWEN

DEFENDER

27 yo Chinese

Li Mengwen started playing football in 2006 at the age of 11 with Suzhou, before joining Jiangsu LFC three years later. With Gérard Prêcheur's former club, the defender won three Chinese Cups (2017, 2018 and 2019), two Chinese League Cups (2018 and 2019) as well as a Chinese championship and Supercup (2019).

Oriane JEAN-FRANCOIS

MIDFIELDER

21 yo French

Originally from French Guiana, Oriane Jean-François started playing football at CO Saint-Laurent-du-Maroni, her home town. She headed to the metropolis in 2016 to join FCF Juvisy, in the U16 category. Three years later, the midfielder signed her first professional contract at Paris FC and made her debut in Division 1 at the age of 18. The French international has since made 50 appearances (1 goal) for PFC. After playing for the national U17 team, the Guyanese played for the U19s, winning the European Championship alongside another Parisian, Laurina Fazer. She then joined the U20 and U23 teams before making her first appearance for Les Bleues against Macedonia in October 2020.

Grace GEYORO

MIDFIELDER

25 yo French

Born in Kolwezi, Democratic Republic of Congo, Young Grace started kicking the ball at the feet of her big brother. Arrived at the Club in 2012, at the age of 15, Grace Geyoro completed all of her training at Paris Saint-Germain. The native of Orléans played her first minutes in the first team on October 12, 2014, against Issy-les-Moulineaux and signed her first professional contract a year later. Became captain this season, the midfielder now has 171 matches and 22 goals scored under the Red and Blue colors, winning a National U19 Challenge (2016), two French Cups (2018, 2022) as well as the title of French champions of D1 during the 2020-2021 season.

#14

Kheira HAMRAOUI

MIDFIELDER

32 yo French

Born in Croix, it was three kilometres away, at Hommelet SC Roubaix, that she first pulled on the boots. The northerner, trained at the Pôle France Féminin de football, started in the first division at FCF Hénin-Beaumont in 2007, made a diversion to Saint-Etienne, and then joined Paris in 2012, staying for four seasons (16 goals in 92 games). In 2016, she left the capital club for Olympique Lyonnais and then made the move to Spain with FC Barcelona, winning two Spanish Championships (2020, 2021), two Spanish Cups (2020, 2021) and one Champions League (2021) in just three years! A vastly experienced player, the France international made her return to Les Rouge et Bleu in the summer of 2021.

18

Laurina FAZER

MIDFIELDER

19 yo French

At the tender age of 16 Laurina Fazer signed her first professional deal with Paris Saint-Germain, the club she has been with throughout her career. The U17 France international from Argenteuil (Val-d'Oise) has already scored four goals in five games for her country, while also ending last season as U19 league champion with Paris Saint-Germain after a 5-1 victory in the final against Olympique Lyonnais. Now, the very young defender has nothing but one objective: becoming a locally produced talent that will shine the spotlight on the Paris academy at the highest level. After a more than convincing 2021-2022 season with the professional group, Laurina was named D1 Arkema's best hope at the UNFP Trophies.

Sandy BALTIMORE

MIDFIELDER

22 yo French

Having arrived at Paris Saint-Germain at the age of 15, the Colombes native wasted no time in making her mark in the professional game. By the age of 20 the indefatigable number 21 had already established herself as one of the key players in Olivier Echouafni's team. Technical and fast, effective and generous, Sandy is a complete player, capable of playing as a full-back or as a forward.

Lieke MARTENS

MIDFIELDER

29 yo Dutch

Lieke Martens started her professional career at the age of 17 with SC Heerenveen. After her first season, she moved to VVV Vento before joining Standard Liege in 2011. The striker then moved on to German club Duisburg and then to Swedish sides Kopparbergs Göteborg FC and FC Rosengard. For the past five seasons, she has played for Barcelona, with whom she won her first Champions League and nine national titles. Lieke Martens was selected for the national team for the first time in 2011. After participating in Euro 2013 and the 2015 World Cup, she won the European Championship title in 2017 with the 'Oranje' in front of their home crowd. The 29-year-old was named best player of the tournament and, a few months later, player of the year by both UEFA and FIFA. The Dutchwoman now has 133 caps and 54 goals for the Netherlands.

Jackie GROENEN

MIDFIELDER

27 yo Dutch

Practising judo alongside football in her native country, Jackie Groenen began her professional career in Germany in 2011 with SG Essen-Schönebeck, before joining MSV Duisburg a few months later. In 2014, the Dutchwoman joined Chelsea FC in England for one season. She returned to Germany in May 2015, signing for FFC Frankfurt. She then played for Manchester United for three seasons, where she made 57 appearances. The Oranje player won the European Championship in 2017 and the Algarve Cup in 2018.

28

Lina YANG

MIDFIELDER

28 yo Chinese

Born in Shangaï (China), Yang Lina joined Shanghai Shengli, who play in the Chinese Women's Football League, in 2015. In her first season with her hometown club, she finished leading scorer in the Chinese FA Cup. Four years later, she won the league title with the same team. Called up by her country's U19 side in 2012, she joined the senior squad three years later. After playing at the Tokyo Olympics, she won the 2022 AFC Women's Asian Cup. She now has 24 caps for China.

Ramona BACHMANN

FORWARD

31 yo

Swiss

Ramona Bachmann was born in Lucerne, Switzerland. She signed for Paris Saint-Germain from Chelsea, where the striker made 47 appearances and scored 7 goals in London, winning two English Championships (2017 and 2019) and an FA Cup (2018). The striker has been a Switzerland international since 2007, and to date she has made 78 appearances and scored 43 goals for her country. In 2015, Ramona played in Nati's first World Cup in Canada, reaching the round of 16.

11

Kadidiatou DIANI

FORWARD

27 yo French

Born in the Paris region, Kadidiatou Diani made her debut in the club of her hometown, Ivry-sur-Seine. Arriving at Paris Saint-Germain in 2017, the striker has made dazzling progress and has been a consistently high performer, notably with more than 100 matches in Rouge et Bleu. A revelation of the 2019 World Cup, the serial goalscorer took the opportunity to show the world her qualities on the football pitch. Having become indispensable to the Parisian squad, she represents the future of Paris Saint-Germain, and has notably extended her contract for 2 years in the summer of 2020. Her power, ability to dribble, strength of character and determination have already made her one of the most promising talents in women's football.

Manssita TRAORE

FORWARD

19 yo French

Manssita Traoré is originally from Seine-Saint-Denis, more precisely from Noisy-le-Grand. In 2014, she started playing football in Neuilly-sur-Marne before joining her hometown club four years later. In 2019, the young striker joined the Paris Saint-Germain training centre. She was voted "Titi d'or" for the 2021-2022 season.

Nina NGUELEU

FORWARD

17 yo French

Born in Yaoundé, Cameroon, Nina Ngueleu joined Paris Saint-Germain's U19 team at the start of the 2020-2021 season. The 17-year-old "Titi" will make her professional debut in the 2021-2022 season, on the Week 22 of the D1 Arkema, against Reims, on 1 June 2022.

GÉRARD PRÊCHEUR

Gérard Prêcheur began his coach career in 1988, with the Olympique de Valence. After four years in the Drôme club, the technician workd for the French Football Federation for 14 years. The former midfielder was coach, technical director and in chief of the high level.

In 2014, the 62 years-old joined Olympique Lyonnais for three seasons, winning the French championship three times, three French cups and two UEFA Women's Champions League. Then, Gérard Prêcheur flew in China to coach the women's team of Jiangsu. He was elected best coach in 2018 with the club of Nankin city, after won a China Cup and a League Cup.




